Activities might include: Mentoring of undergraduates in research or curation of the collections; trained others in the use of UCMP facilities; served as a UCMP docent; hosted museum visitors; gave public lectures/presentations; contributed to the UCMP website, e.g., blog, slide show, updated text, etc.; contributed to the UCMP online collections, e.g., contributed to CalPhotos, updated data records. (Limit 300 words)

9) FOR PRIOR AWARDEES: Please explain the results of any prior funding from UCMP. Indicate the year, source of the funds, and what was accomplished as a result of that support. Please indicate any presentations or publications associated with the funding. (Limit 300 words)

10) Please include a copy of your CV. Make sure it includes a section describing other support you are currently pursuing, plan to pursue, or have already received for your research, including UCMP support, IB support, and external fellowships and awards.
